

From the Desk of : Father Samuel Martin

Praised be Jesus Christ! "The sky is falling" – doesn't it seem like Chicken Little is everywhere these days? With his prognostications of doom and gloom, one wonders if there is some purveyor of pessimism that is subtly sowing his seeds of dissension. And of course the answer is "yes" – his name is satan, the father of lies. Sadly, he finds many of us to carry his message and it's for this reason that I've become increasingly wary of social media as I get older. I follow the news because it's important that we know for whom we should be praying. But I refuse to listen to people who insist on telling me half-truths or how I should be thinking about the issues they present. Given our current political climate, the chorus of "woe is me, the world is over, we're all going to heck in a hand basket" has become deafening. Frankly, I'm not nearly as worried about the political chaos as I am about the distinct possibility of the Cubs winning the pennant - you know that will usher in the Apocalypse, don't you?! Okay, I digress. This is a letter I was thinking of sending to the newspaper because it's time for more of us to stop whining and start doing our part to bring God's Kingdom into our world. And while you'll hear countless theories as to how we got ourselves into this predicament, the bottom line is that we've strayed from God. Attendance at Mass and all worship services is down and has been dropping since the 1950s. Some of this is because of hypocrisy and the sins of the clergy. But more of it is due to our addiction to comfort and our aversion to the cross. While using medicine to mitigate pain is fine, it seems we're obsessed with avoiding suffering at all costs (the proliferation of prescription drugs points in this direction). Once people refuse to see Jesus on the Cross and acknowledge that He promised we would suffer too, then we're susceptible to the devil's lie: "you don't have to suffer." This is an attractive lie, but it leads us to become petulant and petty, much like a pampered puppy who gets whatever he wants. Worse yet, we begin to indulge the fantasy that someone else is responsible for making me happy and providing for all of my needs. Maybe our government can be faulted for some of these trends. But the more mature person looks in the mirror and asks "what can I do for my country?" In a society drifting from God – and Jesus told us that we cannot serve both God and mammon (a.k.a. money) we have devolved to a point we would have once thought impossible. Instead of working to defend the most defenseless human beings, we spend our time bickering about silly solutions like legalizing marijuana or bowing to the latest cultural trend. Now before this begins to sound like we're running up the white flag, allow me to quote from a book I read years ago: "The Church recalls the great men (and women) of Christendom - like Charlemagne, Saint Thomas Aquinas, Saint Francis of Assisi, (Saint Clare, Saint Teresa of Avila) and Saint Francis Xavier, to name a few – and holds them up as models for how true men live. Its message? Essentially this: You can aspire to be one of these – a builder of civilization, a great genius, a servant of God and men, or a heroic missionary – or you can be a self-absorbed nobody fixated on gratifying your appetites. Our society does everything in its power to ensure that you wind up on the latter path. Be your own person. Rise above the herd, declare your independence from a culture that thinks so little of you, and proclaim that you intend to live not as a beast but as a man," (<u>How</u> the Catholic Church Built Western Civilization, pg. 210). Okay, that's what I've been thinking about when I hear so much wailing and grinding of teeth about the depressing world that we inhabit. As Red said in the movie Shawshank Redemption, "Get busy livin' or get busy dyin'."

May God fill our hearts with the wisdom, fortitude, and hope of the Saints!

Youth Ministry News





The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by a priest or deacon. Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to: Bishop William P. Callahan at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. The form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse, Office for Clergy; or on the diocesan website at: www.dioceseoflacrosse.com **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website.
