From the Pastor's Desk:

This past week I was able to take the week off and ventured out to Arizona, Sedona being my point of interest. I have heard, over the years, of the Chapel of the Holy Cross and have always wanted to see this Church built into the side of the mountain. Gazing out at the splendor through the massive windows behind the altar, you are able to witness the beauty God has created for all to see and witness. Those things he has made known to us, allowing us to take in all his majesty. This of course is something I could see and stare at in awe, but what we celebrate today; The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ relies more on faith, than on sight.

You see, the mystery we attempt to wrap our minds around resulted from the last supper in which Jesus instituted the Eucharist. His Body and Blood transformed from bread and wine, and given freely in faith.

If you were able to attend the Eucharistic Miracle display in Medford last month, your eyes would have been opened to over 140 different miracles that have taken place from the early Church until today. God making himself present through the Body and Blood of his Son.

If you weren't able to make it to the display, Google "Eucharistic Miracles" and expect to be amazed at how the Body elevated by the priest or simply in a Monstrance had drops of blood that dripped from it. When tested repeatedly the results came back as AB blood type (universal) coming from distressed heart tissue. This is the exact same result each and every time.

Our Lord wants us to know he is present, that the offering of himself through the bread and wine is a sacrifice he wants us to partake in, to nourish us spiritually and physically.

May each of us never approach communion as anything short of being given our Lord Jesus Christ in the Flesh and through his Blood. We are blessed with a God that only wants the best for us.

I also wanted to let everyone know that the Dispensation granted last year at the onset of COVID has been lifted. The Mass will no longer be live-streamed. I truly believe this is the time we need to start coming back to Church. And by the sheer volume of you coming back, I see you think the same thing. The Holy Water is back, one side of the Church is unrestricted and the other has the ribbons still up for those who are not comfortable. Masks are optional, but highly encouraged for those who have not had the vaccine.

We will eventually get back to normal, but your welfare is my main priority. Stay healthy, think positively, and continue to see and experience the Lord as he wants us to!
