Lively Virtues (Capital Virtues): Generosity
Read CCC1803: The first part of this paragraph is a quote. What is the quote from?
The seven Capital Virtues, also called the Lively Virtues are: Generosity, Brotherly Love, Meekness, Humility, Temperance, Chastity, and Diligence. These virtues help to combat the 7 deadly sins. We will be focusing on these Virtues during Confirmation preparation. Students need to learn and practice these virtues.
<u>Definition of Generosity:</u> Generosity is all about giving and it involves personal sacrifice. Generosity may be shown by giving of your time or money or possessions. To be generous is to be merciful.
Which of the 7 deadly sins (CCC1866) does Generosity overcome?
Example of Generosity: This virtue can involve donating money, or giving up our free time (or talents) for the less fortunate. It could even be in giving our possessions away. It is a great way to detach ourselves from the things of this world, which is exactly what Jesus told the rich young man who asked him what else he must do to gain eternal life over and above keeping the 10 commandments.
