Lively Virtues (Capital Virtues): Meekness

Definition:

Meekness is the virtue that controls resentment at others, and helps us to grow in patience. Through Meekness we are able to remain patient when we are insulted. Angry outbursts at the smallest thing are characteristics of someone who does not have the virtue of meekness.
